

8 Breakthrough Actions on EU litter prevention – 2018 WFD

- 1. Shared responsibility for litter
- 2. The act of **dropping litter** to be an offence (with **penalties**) in all EU countries
- Member states must develop a litter
 prevention strategy in their National Waste
 Management Plans sent to Brussels
- Member states must link land, water & marine litter strategies in national prevention strategies



7 Breakthrough Propositions for litter & prevention of littering (2)

- 5. Member states must **identify the products** that are main source of litter
- 6. Producers required to pay for **litter prevention communications** campaigns
- 7. Member states also obliged to **raise awareness** about litter and prevention of littering
- 8. European Commission to promote information exchange on litter & prevention of littering



A Call for Political Action

- Most Member State Ministers are not aware that these 8 Breakthrough Actions are now EU law
- Little or no evidence that they are being acted on in most countries – in other words, they are breaking
 EU
- If we are serious about litter on the land or in the seas then...
- ...the European Commission, the Committee of the Regions, the Parliament must do more to promote this package to get action across the EU27
- EU Member States simply must implement what has been agreed – the Commission must enforce



Clean Europe Strategy – a blueprint

- Developing national, regional and local litter
 prevention strategies for MS Waste Management
 Plans and implementing them is the most important
 action of all
- As most Member State Ministers would likely not know where to start...
- ...the Network has developed an integrated litter prevention strategy blueprint
- We call it the Clean Europe Strategy
- It is intended to help all stakeholders share the responsibility for tackling litter and the prevention of littering
